Summer is a wonderful opportunity to spend time relaxing and enjoying loads of wonderful books!

Your child has learned many phonics and decoding skills, as well as sight words in first grade. Please be certain he/she continues to practice these skills by reading each day.

Reading with your child and asking him/her questions about what he/she is reading helps to develop comprehension skills. Children usually enjoy sharing the events from a story, and can easily create a new adventure for the main characters, or draw a picture which tells about his/her favorite part of the book.

Be certain to check-out summer programs at your local library! Many libraries conduct free programs and/or contests that encourage reading.

Your child is required to read two books, and complete an activity for each selection. The first book should be one from the Henry and Mudge series, by Cynthia Rylant.

The **second book should be selected by your child**, and can be either fiction or nonfiction. Libraries often have an "easy reader," section, and I have included a list of some well-liked series to help with the selection process.




